GRASMERE DISTRICT NURSING ASSOCIATION.

The Committee wish to draw attention to the following regulations in connection with the services of the District Nurse:—

- I. To attend the sick poor in their homes free, but from those who can afford it a donation to the funds is expected.
- II. To attend lodging house keepers, tradespeople, hotel keepers, farmers, domestic servants, etc., at the rate of 6d. a visit, or daily visit for a week 2s. 6d.
- III. The Nurse may attend other residents or visitors at the rate of 2s. 6d. a visit, or daily visit for a week 10s.; where it does not interfere with her other legitimate work.

It will greatly facilitate matters if people will kindly *pay these charges* to the Treasurer (Miss Simpson, The Wray) as soon as the Nurse's visits are ended.

IV. The Nurse shall attend to all cases brought under her notice by the Doctors, and shall also visit those whose names are sent to her by members of the Committee; in cases of emergency she may attend a case *once* at her own discretion, and in *all cases* shall report of what she has done to the patient's doctor before again visiting the sick person.
