ANNUAL CHURCH MEETING.

A very small meeting assembled in the Rectory Room on February 10th, at 6 p.m. The Chairman after thanking the Officers for their work during the past year referred to the Coronation, and expressed the hope that 1937 would witness the completion of the repairs to the Church Roof. He urged the parishioners to support the Mission in the parish and stressed the importance of preparing to receive the Missioner with open minds. The Councillors should spend more time in prayer, and he hoped that a new Council would attend the Intercession Services with more regularity than had been the case during the past two months. After the Minutes had been signed the Hon. Secretary of the Council submitted his Report. The Hon. Treasurer presented the Balance Sheet. S. OSWALD'S PARISH CHURCH.

On Sunday, 31st January, the Bishop of Carlisle dedicated two important gifts to the Church. A new East Window and a Reredos and Ornaments. A small Tablet of light Hopton-wood stone has been placed in the south wall. It bears the inscription "The East Window was given in memory of Anna Deborah Richardson and Caroline Richardson, of Heugh Folds, Grasmere, 1937." The Window has five lights of plain leaded glass, and is of the same type as the sixteenth-century windows in the north aisle. It replaces a window of Victorian-Gothic design. The gift has been made by the nephews and neices (and their descendants), of Miss Richardson. (Note: The list will be published in the next issue of the Magazine.) The other gift is a Reredos, consisting of four substantial riddle posts of oak, with a carved oak cornice, slightly gilded; Hangings of rich tapestry of a quiet tone, a new Cross and Candlesticks of oak, gilded; a new Carpet, specially made to correspond with that in the sanctuary, and a blue strip for the altar step. The lower altar step has been extended into a wide platform of oak, a seat has been removed from the nave, and the choir stalls have been moved westward. The approach to the altar has thereby gained much in dignity. On the north wing of the cornice there is an incised inscription: "In memory of Henry John Roby, of Lancrigg, and his son's wife, Alice Keturah Roby, lovers of this Church." The gift has been made by Mr. Arthur Roby, K.C., in memory of his father and of his wife.

Much care and thought have been taken by the architect, Mr. H. L. Hicks, of Newcastle, who has supervised the work.

In his address the Bishop spoke of the great attainments of Henry John Roby as a classical scholar; and of the influence exerted by the quiet and devoted lives of Anna Deborah and Caroline Richardson.

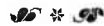

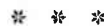
