Tablecloths and Serviettes will be slightly starched but otherwise no starching or hand ironing will be done.

The work will be returned neatly parcelled, and articles require no further attention.

The customer must enter on the opposite a complete list of articles sent, and fill in the name and address in the space provided.

The Bundle must be securely fastened and the label attached.

Handkerchiefs should be all tied in one bundle.
