THE HOLY COMMUNION.

What I suppose we are all feeling is that we want everything possible at the present moment to draw us together and make us feel members of one family. There is no greater or more effective link for this purpose than the Holy Communion: and therefore it will be by no means the wrong time to attempt an experiment. There are many to whom 8 a.m. is not a good time, so once a fortnight we shall try a sung Celebration of the Holy Communion at about 9.30 a.m. The exact time I shall announce later, when we start, which will be probably in October. One further innovation is that there will be provided very simple food in the Rectory Room after the Service. People will be asked to do their own washing up afterwards, but I have found, and so have other priests, that this simple common meal after the Service binds people together very closely. This is merely a first preliminary announcement so that all may get used to the idea.

SCHOOL MANAGERS.

Not only have we to record the loss of a school manager through the death of Major Gordon, but also Mr. Robert Hayes has felt bound to retire from the post of Correspondent which he has held for fifty years. For forty-four years he has never missed a meeting. he has acted as treasurer as well: but for the moment he is still holding that office. At the last meeting of the managers Dr. B. Johnston handed to Mr. Hayes a wallet containing £8, which has been collected as a small testimonial to the work of Mr. Hayes at the school.

On August 5th there was buried John Edward Wiper, a resident of Grasmere well-known to all of us and to the many visitors at the Prince of Wales Hotel, for which he was coach-driver for many years.

To the families of both we offer our deepest sympathy and pray that the souls of the faithful departed may rest in peace.

Also there are two men connected with Grasmere who were fighting in France and are reported missing. More will not be written here until there is more definite news but for the anxious relatives all of us will feel deep commiseration.
