## HOLY WEEK AND EASTER.

The central week of our faith draws near. What should we do about it, if anything? Let us first remember that this week marks the great challenge of our Lord to human selfishness, indifference and apathy: that the ordinary petty bits of pride and self-centredness which we think do not matter were just the motives that actuated all those concerned in the Crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Therefore for one special week, that week, make the real effort to rise to something far above our own ordinary nature. Let us spend some real time in direct communion with Jesus Christ that He may shew us of His will and of His love.

Of His will — remember, it is only through suffering and sacrifice that we attain to joy and possession: that is a law. We cannot avoid it or dodge it. But it is love that makes the difference between an execution and a martyrdom and therefore we must learn to love His will and that we shall never do unless we love Him and that we shall never do unless at some time or other we spend some time with Him to the exclusion of our ordinary activities. If you never spend any real time, or give any attention to someone whom you love, your love will soon wither and die. Therefore use Holy Week to love Him who died for us.

At bottom Christianity is not a system of beliefs or of practices but it is the love of God seen in Jesus Christ. Therefore spend time with the Lover of Men. "When the evening of this life comes, you will be judged on love.
