## RUSHBEARING 1941.

The Rusbearing will take place on 9th August. The children will be on the Churchyard wall with their Bearings at 4.30 p.m. Procession round Church-town at 5 to be followed by service in Church. The Preacher will be the Ven. G. S. Smith, Archdeacon of Furness. The collection will be divided between the Waifs' & Strays' Society and the Laymen's Fund for the Augmentation of Benefices.

On Sunday the Holy Communion will be celebrated at 7 and 8: the Preacher in the morning will be the Bishop of Carlisle.

On Monday, August 11th, the children will fetch their Bearings from Church at 5 p.m. and go to the school field for games and sports.

Owing to the war, it has been found impossible to have the usual tea this year.

## ST. OSWALD'S DAY.

Tuesday, August 5th, is St. Oswald's Day, the day of our patronal saint. There will be a celebration of the Holy Communion at 8 a.m.

Wednesday, August 8th, is the Feast of the Transfiguration when there will be a celebration at 7 a.m.
