### ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING.

The Annual Meeting of Church electors was held on Tuesday, April 1st, in the Rectory Room, the Rector presiding. Apologies for absence were received from Lady O'Dowda, Miss Hills, Mrs. Marston and Miss Squance.

Mr. J. W. Smith, Secretary to the Meeting, read the minutes of the previous annual meeting. These were agreed to and duly signed.

Sir James O'Dowda, Secretary to the Parochial Church Council, then gave a comprehensive account of the work of the Council during 1940. He referred particularly to the new scheme of National Saving among church members, the clerical work for which was being carried out by Sir James Paton.

The Accounts of the Council, presented by Mr. J. W. Smith, audited by Mr. L. Hotson, shewed that a credit balance of 19/5 had been raised to one of £55 : 2 : 0, apart from the £10 usually retained by the Treasurer for current expenses.

It was proposed to pay back to the Roof Fund one half of the temporary loan of last year, *i.e.* £25.

On the motion of Sir James O'Dowda Mr. J. W. Smith was re-appointed Hon. Sec. to the Church Meeting.

Sir James O'Dowda was now commencing his third year of office as Diocesan Representative, and as such became automatically a member of the new Council. The two churchwardens were also *ex-officio* members.

Miss Simpson and Mr. Abbott were then elected Representatives to the Ruridicanal Conference.

The remaining members of the new Council, as elected, were as follows:— Lady Chance, Miss Hills, Mrs. Rawusley,

Miss Squance, Miss Read, Mrs. Garside, Mrs. B. M. Smith, Mr. R. Procter, Mr. P. Peel, Mrs. D. Marston, Mr. T. H. Telford and Mr. W. Palmer.

The following sidesmen were appointed: Sir James O'Dowda, Messrs. R. Hayes, W. Sharp, P. Peel, J. Eccles, Jas. Wilson, W. Thompson, G. L. Borwick, Jack Wilson, Ed. Tyson, Ed. Wilson, A. E. Carradus and H. Smith.

Reference was made to the trees near Wordsworth's grave and it was decided that Mr. Blackhurst be interviewed with respect to trimming.

The condition of the choristers' psalters was also considered and it was decided that the Council's Executive Committee with Mr. Thexton should look into the matter.

### ANNUAL VESTRY MEETING.

There was a very small attendance at the annual vestry meeting held on Thursday, in Easter week in the Church Vestry at 8 p.m. The Rector presided.

Mr. J. W. Smith, Rector's Warden, read the minutes and the accounts. While the General Fund shows a deficit of £2 : 1 : 8 the Poor Fund has a balance of £13 : 17 : 10.

Mr. J. W. Smith was again appointed Rector's Warden and Mr. Albert Smith, People's Warden, each being thanked for past services.

### IN MEMORIAM.

Robert Park was the last of the regular coach-drivers on the Windermere to Keswick route. To visitors of long ago his face was often the first sign that they had really got to Westmorland. Many are the stories told of him and of his adventures in the past and now he has met the last and greatest adventure of all.

John Watson died very peacefully after several years of semi-invalid life. He had been living and working in Town Head for many years and until lately was a regular attender at Church. May God grant to both a quiet rest and life everlasting.
