NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER.

His Majesty the King has asked all of us to observe Friday, September 3rd, as a Day of Prayer.

There will be Celebrations of the Holy Communion at 8 and also at 10-30 p.m.

Other Services rather depend on the arrangements of the B.B.C. I quite realise that most people (including myself) will wish to hear the Archbishop of Canterbury. We were first informed that this Service would be at 7-30 p.m., but now we are told that it will be at 9-35 p.m. The stupidity of the B.B.C. in picking on 7-30 p.m. passes all bounds: if 9-35 p.m. is really correct then there will be a Service in Church at 7-30 p.m.

There will also be a Service in the morning at 9-30 a.m. at which the troops will parade.

The collection at all the Services will be for "The Church's Committee for Work among men and women in H.M. Forces."

PARISH MISSION.

A letter from Brother Charles will now soon be in your hands. There will be a Service of Intercession for the Mission on Wednesdays, 8th and 22nd Sept., at 7-30 p.m. And on Thursday, 9th Sept., there will be a Celebration of the Holy Communion at 10-30 a.m., with the special intention of praying for the Mission,

The preparation work for the Children's Mission will soon be in full swing: their preparation is not so long since little pots boil quickly. But I hope that all of us are beginning if not to boil, at least to simmer, with the thought of the Mission. Remember it daily in your prayers: ask for a real outpouring of the Holy Spirit that all of God's children here in Grasmere may learn to be proud and grateful for that they are sons and daughters of the King of Kings and may live worthy of their vocation. God alone knows what may happen. Only believe: pray with expectancy: something is sure to happen. Especially if you start making arrangements to come to the Mission yourself and bring others with you. Whom are you going to bring?

THE JEWS.

The problem of the Jews is weighing heavily on many of us. Attention is called to a book "Justice for my People," by Ernst Frankenstein, which is very illuminating on the question of Palestine. It is published by Nicholson & Watson for 7/6.

GREAT DAYS IN SEPTEMBER.

Sept. 21st, Tuesday: St. Matthew: usually thought of as the author of the first Gospel: modern scholars think it more likely that he wrote some sayings of Jesus Christ which later were put with an account of His life and that this result is what we know as the Gospel according to St. Matthew. According to tradition he preached in later life in Persia where he was martyred.

Celebration of the Holy Communion at 8 a.m.

Sept. 29th, Wednesday: St. Michael and All Angels: the Angels played an important part in the Gospel story: some modern people like to annihilate them and deny their existence. If we think of them simply as messengers of God and as examples to us of true worship and service we shall not listen perhaps to the pundits.
