THE DIOCESAN PILGRIMAGE OF YOUTH.

On 1st and 2nd June about 500 of the young people of the Diocese and their leaders gathered at Carlisle for a Pilgrimage to the Cathedral.

The Grasmere party consisted of Margaret Allonby, Sheila Smith, Barbara Tyson, Eleanor Thompson, Mary Wallace, Norman Dixon, Grenfell Smith, Gerald Wilson and Miss Barton.

The eight young people were billeted in Upperby Parish and their leader in St. Aidan's, Carlisle.

We met at the Cathedral at 7-0 p.m. for a Service of Thanksgiving. The service was conducted by the Dean of Carlisle the Very Rev. C. Mayne, assisted by Canon Code, and the preacher was Rev. Norman Robinson, Vicar of St. Paul's, Barrow. The Bishop of Penrith, the Archdean of Carlisle, Canon Phythian Adams, and many of the parochial clergy of Carlisle and district were also present.

After the service a procession was formed. First the Processional Cross of the Cathedral and all the Servers from the various parishes who were present in their robes, then the Clergy of the district and the Cathedral, followed by a banner behind which came all the pilgrims. After the procession through the streets of Carlisle the service concluded with the blessing given by the Bishop from the steps of the Fratry.

A Concert in the Figure then followed, all the items being provided by the young people themselves with the Vicar of Holy Trinity Carlisle as chairman.

On Sunday morning we attended the early celebrations in the parishes where we were billeted. At 11-0 a.m. we all met again at the Cathedral for the Choral Eucharist when the sermon was again preached by the Rev. N. Robinson.

After Church we caught the 1 45 p.m. bus and arrived back in Grasmere at 5-15 p.m. after a very enjoyable week-end, all of us aving made friendships which we hope to renew in the future.
