SCOUTS

This journey will be something of a venture, but the total cost of the scout should not exceed 32/- for the week. The site is on land owned by Major Robertson of Dalbeattie and is quite close to the coast where there are sea bathing facilities.

It is hoped that all the scouts in the troop will be able to come this year and parents are asked to do what they can to see that the boys get the chance.

An early decision is essential as places on the long distance bus must be booked.

The Scout concert in February was a most successful venture and realised a sum of about £24 clear for the funds.

The parents committee has suggested that a portion of the proceeds be earmarked for starting a fund to provide the scouts and cubs with a hut of their own.

The Scoutmaster wishes to thank all parents who have gone to the considerable expense of providing their boys with correct uniform.

The National "Bob a Job" week for scouts will be held April 20th to 23rd. During this week scouts throughout the country are endeavouring to do a job of work which will earn at least 1/- for the movement in order to make the national finances of the movement secure. Each scout, when applying for his job, will have a card to be completed by the employer. Do please find them work and we hope it will be satisfactorily completed. All money must be earned.
