THE BISHOP'S APPEAL FOR CHURCH SCHOOLS.

At the last Diocesan Conference and again in a Pastoral Letter read in all churches in the diocese during October, the Bishop of Carlisle has been re-emphasising the importance and the needs of Church Schools. He writes:—

"We must face the fact that many Church Schools must be completely renovated or replaced. Towards the cost of this the State will contribute 50 per cent. Our policy will be to maintain as many aided schools as possible, and I am bound to declare more conviction that this is in the interest of the country as well as of religion. If we lose our schools there will only be one authorized apart from the Roman Catholic Church which will control education, and that authority will be the State. There could be no better preparation for totalitarianism than to permit the moulding and fashioning of the minds of children to be under one authoritative Minister or Department of State. . . . I am in conscience bound and declare my conviction that such is wrong, and that the Church must do her utmost to preserve islands of freedom in the educational system for the sake of the country and the Kingdom of God."

The Bishop therefore asks that by the end of 1950 the dioces as a whole, shall aim at raising £25,000 for this cause, and that each parish shall volunteer its own target.

At a meeting of Grasmere Parochial Church Council on October 27th, it was agreed to support the Bishop's Appeal, and resolved that we in Grasmere shall aim at raising £250 for this purpose by the end of 1950. Ways and means will be discussed in detail later but it is important that parishioners should know at this earliest possible moment of the extent of this task to which we have committed ourselves.
