

**‘Building Grasmere’s Future’  
27<sup>th</sup> September 2016

There were 36 people at the meeting, who wrote down their ideas on five sheets of paper. Four out of the five sheets envisaged a “village hub” (as one group described it) including a school and community facilities.

This is a collated list of all the written responses. Many were repeated, and so are only recorded once below. They have not been censored in any way, and represent the views of the individual(s) who wrote them down.

The “community” was described as: residents, businesses, visitors, land / property owners, employees, pupils/students.

One group also wrote, “There isn’t a plan. Need a plan.”  
Hopefully the meeting was the first step towards a plan.
